ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Government Model Women College, Bilasipara, is a premier institution established by the Government of Assam to disseminate higher education among the women in Bilasipara area and throughout Assam.

The college is located in Chirakuta Village, Bilasipara in the Dhubri district. It was established in 2023 by the Assam government to meet the region's educational needs. The college is situated adjacent to the SDO Civil's Office, Bilasipara, amidst scenic surroundings, it creates a peaceful and suitable learning environment. The institution is affiliated to Gauhati University which offers a Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) with six departments: Assamese, English, Economics, Education, History, and Political Science. The wide range of departments emphasizes the college's dedication to provide a well-rounded education that fits the demands of students of all backgrounds. The Young enthusiastic mind of the faculty members, their passion, knowledge and experience will bring a wealth of knowledge, experience, and passion to the classroom, creating an environment for academic excellence and personal growth. They will help the new generation to grow academically, psychologically and intellectually. Govt. Model Women College, Bilasipara, with its emphasis on offering quality education and holistic development, possesses the potential to become a premier educational institution in the region, empowering female students and contributing to the community's overall development.



COURSE STRUCTURE

From the academic session 2023-204 Gauhati University has introduced the Four Years Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP). The course shall be of Eight Semesters. A student needs to earn a required number of credits in order to successfully complete a degree.

The detailed course structure for a 3-Year Bachelor Degree (As available in Gauhati University Website) is represented in the figure below. This structure depicts a general scenario where a student will chose one major course and two minor courses. It is to be noted that in order for a re-entry into the 3-Year course in Semester III or V for students who have opted for leaving the course after the 1st and 2nd year respectively, additional vocational course of 4-credit has to be done by the student on exit.




Fig. Course Structure for a 3-year Bachelor Degree. The numbers indicate credits in the paper. The Voc-1 and Voc-2 papers are vocational courses that a student would have to take in the case of exiting in the 1st or 2nd year. These courses are NOT compulsory in general, but a student will need them for re-entry into the programme.


In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years.

If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally, if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, she will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, she needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathways.

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

FYUGP Progression



The progression and multiple exits during the whole course structure is given below.

After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra

Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirement is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational course).

After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirement is 88 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, she can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160. It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

N.B.: Every student who wants to exit before 3 years into the programme, MUST complete an additional Vocational Course of 4 credits.

COURSES OFFERED AT GMWC, BILASIPARA

There are four different options which a student can choose to complete a 4 – Year programme under FYUGP

- 1. 4-Year Bachelor Degree with one major and two minors.
- 2. 4-Year Bachelor Degree with one major and two minors with an elective paper on Research Methodology in 5th Semester.
- 3. 4-Year Bachelor Degree with no major and three minors.
- 4. 4-Year Bachelor Degree with one minor and option for double major.

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, a student either chooses 1 Major 2 Minors or 3 Minors scheme from among the subjects given above. A student needs to complete minimum of 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. A Major course must carry a minimum credit of 60 and one Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors. But if a student desires, using the free credits, s/he can easily complete a third Minor as well.

Common Courses at GMWC, Bilasipara

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry a total credit of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below

Multi-disciplinary

Courses Each student needs to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from the following sub group

Humanities and Social Sciences

The levels of these courses are of Class XII.

Value Added Course (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from following sub groups

1. Environmental Science (Compulsory)

- 2. Any one paper from following sub groups
- i. Understanding India
- ii. Digital and Technological Solutions

Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL)/Alternative English and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The MIL/Alternative English course is to be completed during Semesters 1 & 5 and the English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 2 & 6.

Internship

All student is to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

FEE STRUCTURE

Fee structure for FYUGP will be as per the uniform fee structure of Directorate of Higher Education (DHE), Assam.

Fee Waiver Scheme

GMWC, Bilasipara provides Free Admission to the students based on following three conditions:

- ❖ An Income certificate issued by Local Revenue Circle Officer. Family Annual Income should be less than 2 Lakhs
- Declaration from the student. (Format may be downloaded from the website)
- ❖ Students will have to plant a sapling at college premises and shall give photographs of the same to the college.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

For admission to the course a student has to apply

through SAMARTH Portal (Link- https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/). Initially, she needs to register herself with a mobile number and an email ID. Once the registration process is completed, she has to select Govt. Model Women College, Bilasipara as her preferred college. The college will prepare the merit list, and the selection list will be sent via mobile number and email.
